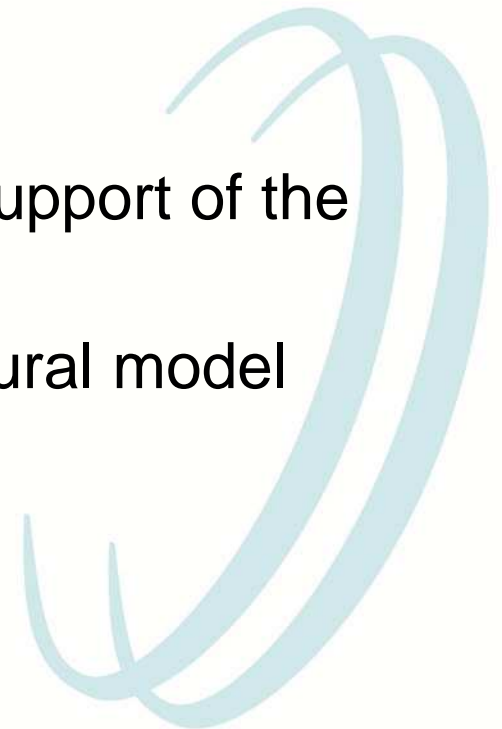

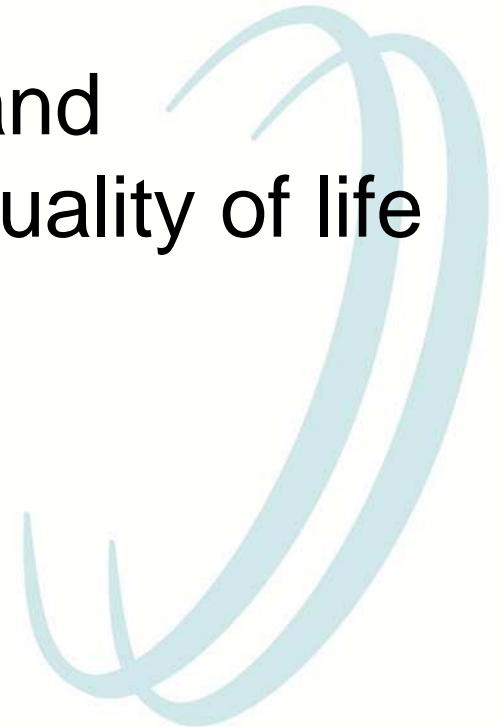
What is PBS?

- An Approach where the focus is not on 'fixing' the person or on the behaviour itself
- Value based
- Emphasis on teaching the person more effective/acceptable/alternative behaviours than the challenging one (or two!)
- Least restrictive option
- Environmental changes to assist with the support of the person
- Deeply immersed in the functional behavioural model



SET Behaviour Support Service

- Established in 1996 within old Down Lisburn Trust
- Adopted a Multi-elemental Approach to behaviour management
- Effective with many individuals and demonstrated many increased quality of life outcomes.



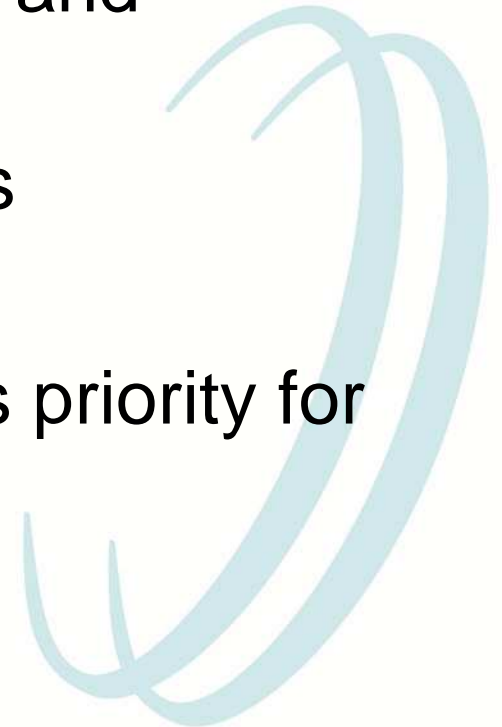
Barriers to Progress

- Lack of generalisation of the concept with individual plans implemented in services
- Limited training and emphasis on Health & Safety in mandatory requirements
- Development of plans seen as a 'specialist' role.



Development of ISS

- Implemented in April 2016, increased resource
- Extension to BSS
- Numerous models across NI
- Incorporates Mental health, Forensic and behavioural referrals
- Aim to enhance training opportunities
- Bild PBS Coach training
- Senior management endorsement as priority for services



PBS training roll out

- Aim of this training is to bring theory to Practice and is competence based
- Based on the National framework “Positive Behavioural Support – A competence Framework”
- 4 stages to the pilot training



Prerequisite understanding

(Service Provider responsibility)

- NISCC induction book
- Ensuring services are values led
- Knowing the person we are supporting
- Matching support with each person's capabilities and with goals and outcomes that are personally important to them
- Establishing clear roles and effective team work
- Legislation that underpins good practice
- Commitment to behaviour skills Training



Stage 1 - Outcome Measurement

– Baseline data

Before Training- 3 stage process

- **Stage 1 - Pre-test**
- Part 1 – Trainee's current knowledge on Positive Behaviour Support
- Part 2 – Trainee's attitude on the benefit of a positive behaviour support approach

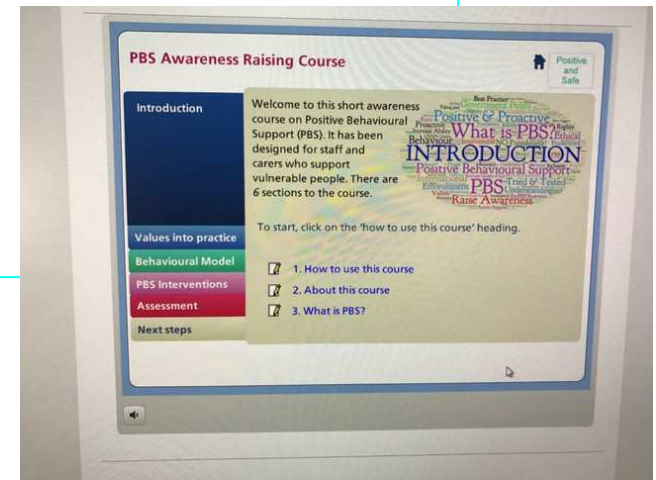


Stage 2- Outcome Measurement

Stage 2 – E learning module

- BILD- PBS awareness course
- <http://www.bild.org.uk/our-services/positive-behaviour-support/capbs/pbs-awareness-course/>
- To progress into the training - 80% pass rate in the online assessment
- Trainees to produce their assessment print outs for discussion with behaviour practitioner
- Number of attempts it took for the trainee to achieve pass mark in assessment

Stage 3 – Post- test

- Test provided again with the same questions as stage 1 in different random sample

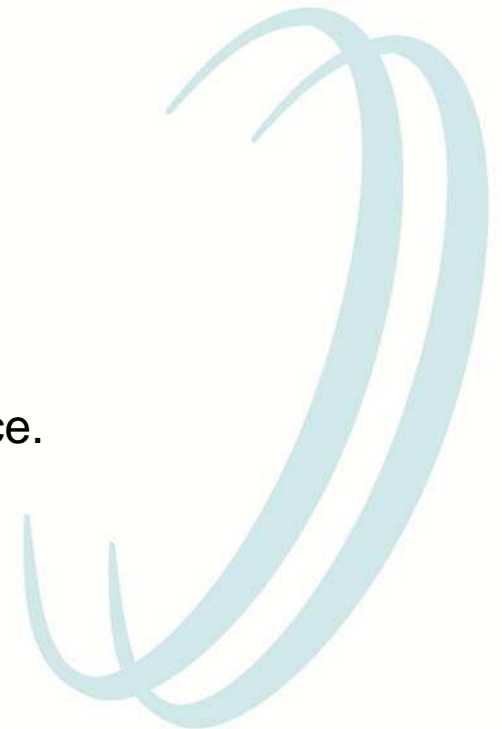

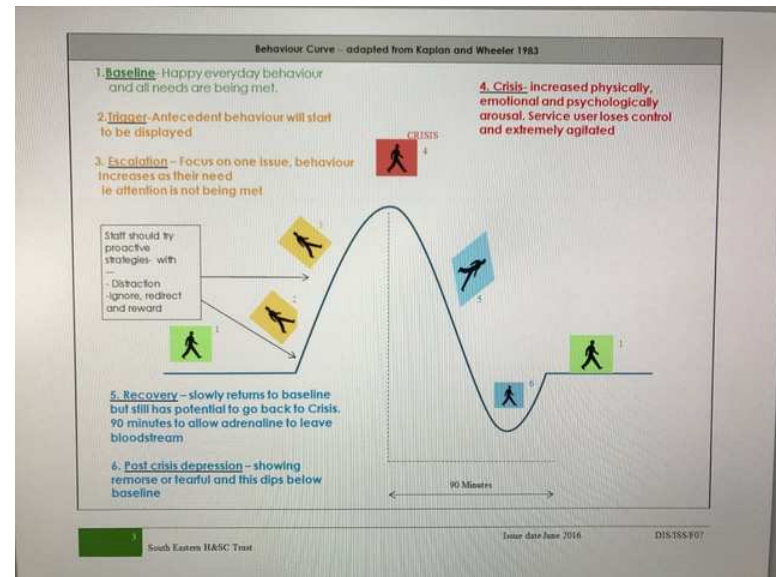

- Baseline behaviours



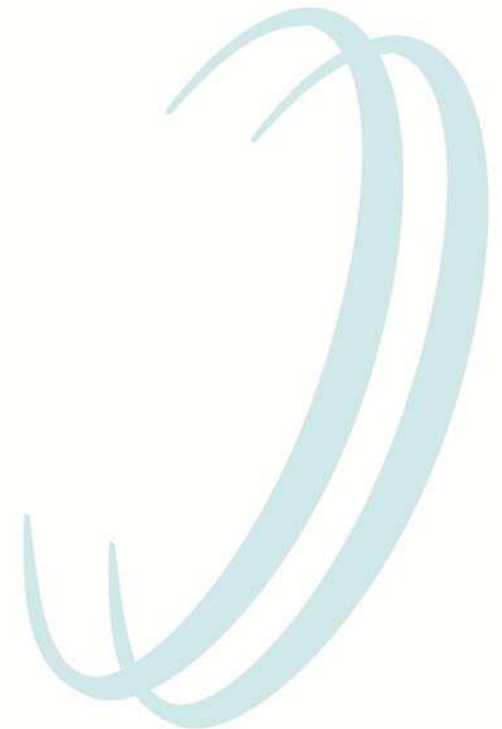
Module 4- Data collection
