### Introduction

The role of the Maternity Support Worker (MSW) is to assist in caring for women<sup>1</sup> and their families throughout pregnancy, labour and the postnatal period, working under the direction and supervision of a registered midwife and within agreed guidelines and protocols.

The Standards (below) outline the role, conduct and behaviours required of Maternity Support Workers (2023)<sup>2</sup>.

### **Standards for Maternity Support Workers (2023)**

- 1. Support the delivery of safe, woman-centred and compassionate care for families who use our services.
- 2. Communicate openly and honestly to promote the health and wellbeing of families who use our services.
- Maintain your knowledge, skills and experience to enable you to do your
  job effectively, in order to improve the quality of care for families who use
  our services.
- 4. Respect and protect at all times the right to confidentiality, privacy and dignity for families who use our services.

### **The MSW Education Programme**

It is essential that trainee MSWs are supported to develop their knowledge, skills, behaviours and subsequent competency aligned to the Standards for Maternity Support Workers (2023).

The SHSCT Vocational Workforce Assessment Centre (VWAC) is responsible for the management, coordination and delivery of the Regulated Qualifications Framework (RQF) Level 3 Diploma in Healthcare Support (Maternity Support Worker). This is the qualification awarded on the completion of the MSW education programme and is affiliated with the ProQual Awarding Organisation.

The trainee MSW must complete the following four components of the MSW education programme within the programme timeline structure<sup>3</sup> in order to attain the RQF Level 3 Diploma in Healthcare Support (MSW):

- 1. Regulated Qualifications Framework (RQF) units
- 2. MSW in-house education programmes
- 3. HSC Clinical Education Centre programmes
- 4. Mandatory training programmes specific for the MSW role

A nominated vocational assessor will be assigned to provide guidance and support to the trainee MSW. They will also advise the trainee MSW on how to plan and collect the required evidence for their learning and development portfolio that will support the requirements of the RQF Level 3 Diploma qualification.

The line manager within each HSC Trust clinical area is responsible for partnering the trainee Maternity Support Worker with a registered midwife who will act as a facilitator<sup>4</sup> providing professional support, advice and guidance in the clinical environment.

The vocational assessor in partnership with the registered midwife will facilitate appropriate learning environments and opportunities to support and develop the trainee MSW's competence and confidence throughout the duration of the MSW education programme.

The vocational assessor in partnership with the registered midwife will be responsible for supporting the trainee MSW in their learning and development of the clinical skills listed in Sections 1 and 2. They will also act as an assessor to determine the trainee's ability to perform the clinical skills safely and effectively.

The trainee MSW must observe each of the clinical skills at least once and perform the skills the prescribed number of times under supervision of either the registered midwife or the vocational assessor (if available). The registered midwife or the vocational assessor will assess the trainees' competence in performing the clinical skill. In signing off a competency, the registered midwife or the vocational assessor is agreeing that the trainee MSW is competent in this clinical skill.

If required, the trainee MSW may obtain additional support and supervision in performing the clinical skills before being finally signed off as competent. This additional support should be managed by the registered midwife or the vocational assessor.

The vocational assessor will facilitate and support the trainee MSW to complete the education programmes identified in Sections 3 and 4.

In completing this MSW Training and Competency Booklet, the trainee MSW in partnership with the registered midwife and the vocational assessor can demonstrate details of the training and competencies achieved, as well as identify areas of practice and skills, which require further development. The booklet will also support the trainee MSW to reflect on their learning in practice.

### **Competency and Delegation**

### **Assessment of Competence**

Competence is defined in the NIPEC framework 'Deciding to Delegate: A Decision Support Framework for Nursing and Midwifery'<sup>5</sup>, as the knowledge, skills, attitude and ability to practise safely without direct supervision (NIPEC, 2018).

Until competence is achieved and signed off, the trainee MSW will be directly or indirectly supervised by a registered midwife during all aspects of care delivery. Direct supervision involves the registered midwife working with the trainee MSW to enable direct monitoring of activities. Indirect supervision is appropriate at the point at which the trainee MSW requires consolidation of skills and confidence building to enable independent working.

The midwife is accountable for the decision to delegate care and will only delegate care to the MSW when they have completed the appropriate training and are deemed competent to perform the delegated activity without direct supervision.

### **Delegation**

Delegation is defined in the NIPEC framework: 'Deciding to Delegate: A Decision Support Framework for Nursing and Midwifery', as the process by which a registered midwife (delegator) allocates clinical or non-clinical tasks and duties to a competent person (delegatee). The delegator remains accountable for the overall management of practice, for example, the plan of care for a service user and accountable for the decision to delegate. The delegator will not be accountable for the decisions and actions of the delegatee.

The delegatee is accountable for their own actions including adherence to their:

- professional standards
- employment standards
- organisational policies and procedures

### **Core Competencies for Maternity Support Workers**

The core competencies for MSWs have been mapped under the following four domains used in the Nursing and Midwifery Pathway; working in health and social care | NIPEC (hscni.net). These are listed in detail on pages: 8 to 10.

**Domain 1.** Clinical Practice

Domain 2. Education and Learning

**Domain 3.** Research and Evidence-based Practice

Domain 4. Leadership and Management

These competencies reflect the knowledge and skills that an MSW must be able to demonstrate on completion of their programme and provides them with the opportunity to build upon as they gain experience in practice.

The MSW core skills (Appendix 1) specifies the details that an MSW must be able to demonstrate safely and effectively in order to meet these MSW competencies. Additional information on the education programmes linked to the MSW core skills are also found in Appendix 1.

### **Core Competencies for Maternity Support Workers**

### **MSW Core Competency Domain 1: CLINICAL PRACTICE**

The Maternity Support Worker uses effective clinical and communication skills when carrying out safe effective woman and family-centred care which has been delegated by a midwife, within the limits of their competence.

Provide care in line with the relevant HSC/Trust guidelines, protocols, policies, procedures and DoH Maternity Support Worker Standards (2023)<sup>6</sup>.

Observe and report any changes in the woman's and /or infant's clinical condition to the midwife in a timely manner.

Provide support and reassurance to women who are vulnerable and/or who may have additional mental, physical, psychological or socioeconomic needs reporting concerns to the midwife.

Document care in line with the NI Record Keeping Guidelines (NIPEC, 2016)<sup>7</sup> and the HSC IT systems.

Be aware of how to access and adhere to legal and professional guidance pertinent to working in the role as a Maternity Support Worker.

#### Provide care to the woman as delegated by a midwife, to include:

- Clinical care and support for the woman and her family
- · Routine maternal clinical observations and monitoring, reporting any deviations from normal to the midwife in a timely manner
- Information, education and resources for women and their families to support informed decision making
- Public health promotion and education either as a group or on a one to one basis
- Infant feeding assessment and support
- Bereavement and pregnancy loss support
- Arrange and process screening tests and procedures
- Supporting the creation and maintenance of environments that promote the health, safety and wellbeing of women and their families
- Support and information on the care of the infant

#### Provide care to the infant as delegated by a midwife, to include:

- Routine skin, eye and umbilical care
- Routine clinical observations, reporting any deviations from normal to the midwife in a timely manner
- Capillary blood sampling

- Promoting parent-infant attachment
- Assisting with identification and security of the infant

Work within own role to respond to emergencies and summon help when required

### **MSW Core Competency Domain 2: EDUCATION and LEARNING**

The Maternity Support Worker participates in relevant education and learning opportunities and is supported to improve their knowledge, skills and behaviours.

The Maternity Support Worker will:

Undertake work-based induction and relevant education/training.

Engage with line manager to identify professional education and development needs and undertake appropriate learning and development as part of appraisal and personal development planning.

Support new and existing Maternity Support Workers and members of the multi-disciplinary team.

Undertake mandatory training and relevant professional updates as per HSC Trust requirements, to include reflective practice where appropriate.

Share best practice with others.

### MSW Core Competency Domain 3: RESEARCH and EVIDENCE-BASED PRACTICE

The Maternity Support Worker follows relevant guidelines, protocols, policies and procedures and understands the need to provide evidence-based care.

The Maternity Support Worker will:

Follow the direction of the midwife in accordance with the relevant evidence-based guidance.

Participate in quality improvement activities, research and audits as directed by the midwife.

### **MSW Core Competency Domain 4: LEADERSHIP and MANAGEMENT**

The Maternity Support Worker is a vital member of the maternity services care team and works with other health care professionals to provide quality care and services.

The Maternity Support Worker will:

Work within the DoH Maternity Support Workers' Standards (DoH, 2023) and competencies.

Contribute effectively as a member of the multi-disciplinary team.

Apply the principles of Continuity of Midwifery Carer when supporting women and their families across a range of maternity care settings.

Manage their clinical workload and effectively prioritise delegated duties.

**Please note**: The MSW will undertake only the physiological measurements of the mother listed below. This **will not** include assessment of PV loss or uterine tone.
