

Northern Ireland Implementation of the NMC Post-registration Standards

Did you know that:

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The Standards will be implemented in September 2024.

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Annotations on the NMC register will remain for registrants who already hold a non-community SPQ qualification.

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The same principles and processes will apply to all community and non-community SPQ programmes.

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Independent and Supplementary prescribing will be integrated seamlessly into SPQ programmes.

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To enroll in a SPQ or SCPHN programme you will need a BSc Hons/ BSc Degree OR successfully complete academic study at level 6.

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Part-time and full-time options are available.

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Programme places are available to eligible NMC registered nurses and/or midwives including NHS, non-NHS, self-employed or self-funded/sponsored applicants.

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There is greater service user involvement in the planning, development and delivery of the programmes.

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Practice Supervisor and Practice Assessor preparation programmes are available via the university delivered both online or face-to-face.
