

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A Neighbourhood District Nursing Model of Care

The Department of Health is supporting the testing of a prototype model for a comprehensive 24 Hour District Nursing Service, being led by Public Health Agency. The Neighbourhood District Nursing Model of Care is based on a new Neighbourhood District Nursing Team which will be an integral part of the enhanced multi-disciplinary primary care team. The prototype model of care will be tested in identified areas within the Primary Care MDT initial roll-out sites, in the first instance, in South Eastern Trust with a Practice in the Down Federation and in the Western Trust with a Practice in the Derry Federation. Eileen McEneaney, Executive Director of Nursing, Northern HSC Trust and Eleanor Ross, Assistant Director, PHA are co-chairing a Steering Group taking this work forward. *The District Nursing Framework 2018-2026* can be accessed on https://www.health-ni.gov.uk/sites/default/files/publications/health/district-nursing-framework2018.pdf

NMC Register opens to Nursing Associates

Nursing and Midwifery Council is now in law the regulator for nursing associates in England. NMC will publish the finalised nursing associate standards in October 2018, will open the nursing associate part of NMC register in January 2019.

NMC Fitness to Practise strategy

The NMC has published its new Fitness to Practise strategy and it will launch its full service in October 2018. It has new criteria for when a case needs to be heard at a hearing, with the aim of resolving more cases at meetings, and only holding full hearings in exceptional circumstances. 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Nursing and Midwifery Board of Ireland (NMBI) – Inactive File Disbandment

The Nursing and Midwifery Board of Ireland (NMBI) is the Republic of Ireland regulator for the professions of the nursing and midwifery. In accordance with GDPR 2018, the inactive file comprising the contact details of nurses and midwives who are not in active practice will be disbanded in March 2019. If you are on a nurse or midwife on NMBI inactive file then you can

- 1. Remain on the NMBI Register in 2019 by paying an Annual Retention Fee (ARF) of €100;
- 2. Request to be voluntarily removed from the Register; or
- 3. Be removed for non-payment of the ARF, as part of the removal process in March 2019.
